

These terms and conditions, together with any proposal, estimate or fee quote, form the agreement between you (the **Client**) and the Intertek entity (**Intertek**) providing the services contemplated therein.

1. INTERPRETATION

- 1.1 In this Agreement, the following words and phrases shall have the following meanings unless the context otherwise requires:
- (a) **Agreement** means this agreement entered into between Intertek and the Client;
 - (b) **App** means an Application owned by Intertek, which the Client can download onto a mobile device and use to assist the Inspector when performing Remote Inspections;
 - (c) **Charges** shall have the meaning given in Clause 4.2;
 - (d) **Confidential Information** means all information in whatever form or manner presented which: (a) is disclosed pursuant to, or in the course of the provision of Services pursuant to, this Agreement; and (b) (i) is disclosed in writing, electronically, visually, orally or otherwise howsoever and is marked, stamped or identified by any means as confidential by the disclosing party at the time of such disclosure; and/or (ii) is information, howsoever disclosed, which would- reasonably be considered to be confidential by the receiving party;
 - (e) **ICT** means information communication technology which shall include the App owned by Intertek;
 - (f) **Intellectual Property Right(s)** means copyrights, trademarks (registered or unregistered), patents, patent applications (including the right to apply for a patent), service marks, design rights (registered or unregistered), trade secrets and other like rights howsoever existing
 - (g) **Report(s)** shall mean any certificate, report, or other material prepared by Intertek describing the results of any Services performed by Intertek;
 - (h) **Services** means the inspection (remote or otherwise) or audit performed in relation to the product conformity assessment programme carried out by Intertek on behalf of governments, government bodies or any other public entity;
 - (i) **Remote Inspection** means a form of visual inspection of samples or products, conducted by the Inspector by directing the Client to move to certain areas to allow the Inspector to inspect the samples or products via a direct video link by using the Remote Inspections App;
 - (j) **Proposal** means the proposal, estimate, or fee quote, if applicable, provided to the Client by Intertek relating to the Services; and
 - (k) **Inspector** means Intertek inspector responsible for performance of the Services.

THE SERVICES

- 1.2 Intertek shall provide the Services to the Client in accordance with the terms of this Agreement which is expressly incorporated into any Proposal Intertek has made and submitted to the Client.
- 1.3 In the event of any inconsistency between the terms of this Agreement and the Proposal, the terms of [this Agreement](#) shall take precedence.
- 1.4 Where the Client instructs Intertek to perform a Remote Inspection, the Client agrees and warrants: (i) to provide Intertek, with complete, accurate, and the most current information and documentation to perform the Remote Inspection; (ii) to download the App onto the Client's smartphone and use the App solely for the purposes of the Remote Inspection; (iii) to allow the Inspector to direct the camera of the smartphone while using the App, to allow the Inspector to perform the Remote Inspection and (iv) the Client shall be solely responsible for ensuring sufficient internet connectivity to perform the remote inspection. If internet connectivity fails during the Remote Inspection, the Client shall make all attempts to reconnect, if reconnection is not possible a physical inspection will be scheduled. The Client may be charged for such any connection failure and if an inspection has to be rescheduled.
- 1.5 The Services provided by Intertek under this Agreement and any memoranda, laboratory data, calculations, measurements, estimates, notes, certificates and other material prepared by Intertek in the course of providing the Services to the Client, together with status summaries or any other communication in any form describing the results of any work or services performed (Report(s)) shall be for the Client's use and benefit and any government authority, where applicable.
- 1.6 The Client acknowledges and agrees that any Services provided and/or Report produced by Intertek are done so within the limits of the scope of work and instructions agreed with the Client and pursuant to the Client's specific instructions or, in the absence of such instructions, in accordance with any relevant trade, custom, usage or practice.
- 1.7 The Client authorises Intertek to deliver a Report to a third party where so instructed by the Client or at its discretion, where it implicitly follows from circumstances, trade, custom, usage or practice. The Client understands that reliance on any Reports issued by Intertek is limited to the facts and representations set out in the Reports which represent Intertek's review and/or analysis of facts, information, documents, products and/or other materials in existence at the time of the performance of the Services only.
- 1.8 Client is responsible for acting as it sees fit on the basis of such Report. Neither Intertek nor any of its officers, employees, agents or subcontractors shall be liable to Client nor any third party for any actions taken or not taken on the basis of such Report.
- 1.9 In agreeing to provide the Services pursuant to this Agreement, Intertek does not abridge, abrogate or undertake to discharge any duty or obligation of the Client to any other person or any duty or obligation of any person to the Client.
- 1.10 The Client acknowledges that Intertek's internal auditors are authorised to amend or overturn the recent inspection outcome if the Result of the Services supports this action. The Services will be conducted in a manner that does not unduly interfere with the export of the products nor jeopardize the Client's legitimate interests.
- 1.11 The Client acknowledges that approved laboratories are acting as independent laboratories. In the event of conflict between the Client and an approved laboratory relating to the testing of the products, the dispute shall be resolved by the two parties, without involvement or responsibility on the part of Intertek.

2. INTERTEK'S WARRANTIES

- 2.1 Intertek warrants to the best of its knowledge exclusively to the Client:
- (a) that it has the power and authority to enter into this Agreement and that it will comply with relevant legislations and regulations in force as at the date of this Agreement in relation to the provision of the Services;
 - (b) that any Report issued in response to the Client's instructions for the Services will be issued with due care, in accordance with the best industry practices and within the limits of the mandate received from the relevant Government to perform the Services;
 - (c) that it will take reasonable steps to ensure that whilst on the Client's premises its personnel comply with any health and safety rules and regulations and other reasonable security requirements made known to Intertek by the Client in accordance with Clause 3.3(f); and
 - (d) that the Reports produced in relation to the Services will not infringe any legal rights (including Intellectual Property Rights) of any third party. This warranty shall not apply where the infringement is directly or indirectly caused by Intertek's reliance on any information, other related documents provided to Intertek by the Client, or by any of its agents or representatives.
- 2.2 In the event of a breach of the warranty as provided in clause 2.1 above, Intertek shall, at its own expense, perform services of the type originally performed as may be reasonably required to correct any defect in Intertek's performance.
- 2.3 Intertek makes no other warranties, express or implied. All other warranties, conditions and other terms implied by statute or common law (including but not limited to any implied warranties of merchantability and fitness for purpose) are, to the fullest extent permitted by law, excluded from this Agreement. No performance, deliverable, oral or other information or advice provided by Intertek

(including its agents, sub-contractors, employees or other representatives) will create a warranty or otherwise increase the scope of any warranty provided.

3. CLIENT WARRANTIES AND OBLIGATIONS

- 3.1 The Client represents and warrants:
- (a) that it has the power and authority to enter into this Agreement and procure the provision of the Services for itself;
 - (b) that it is securing the provision of the Services hereunder for its own account and not as an agent or broker, or in any other representative capacity, for any other person or entity;
 - (c) that any information, products and related documents it (or any of its agents or representatives) supplies to Intertek (including its agents, sub-contractors and employees) is, true, accurate representative, complete and is not misleading in any respect. The Client further acknowledges that Intertek will rely on such information, products or other related documents and materials provided by the Client (without any duty to confirm or verify the accuracy or completeness thereof) in order to provide the Services;
 - (d) that any products provided by the Client to Intertek will be shipped pre-paid in a timely manner for Intertek to perform the Services without any delay;
 - (e) that any samples provided by the Client to Intertek will be shipped pre-paid and will be collected or disposed of by the Client (at the Client's cost) within thirty (30) days after testing unless alternative arrangements are made by the Client. In the event that such samples are not collected or disposed of by the Client within the required thirty (30) days, Intertek reserves the right to destroy the samples, at the Client's cost
 - (e) that any information, products or other related documents (including without limitation certificates and reports) provided by the Client to Intertek will not, in any circumstances, infringe any legal rights (including Intellectual Property Rights) of any third party;
 - (f) to take full responsibility to ensure: (i) the goods shipped are the same goods that were presented for inspection (whether remote or otherwise) or certification at the Client's or third-party premises and (ii) any information (including information with regard to inspection location and goods), samples and related documents provided by the Client in relation to any Inspection (remote or otherwise) shall be true, accurate and not misleading in any respect;
 - (g) that it will not use, nor refer to the Intertek name, trademark or brand name on labels, product brochures, advertising or sales promotion material which indicates or implies that a product is listed or approved by Intertek until written authorisation has been received by the Client for such use. The Report issued is only for the products evaluated and verified by Intertek and must not be used in communication media and any marketing documents to indicate otherwise; and
 - (h) that all imported goods which are subject to specific programme requirements may be randomly selected for inspection and testing for safety, quality and trade compliance purposes at the customs territory of the importing country. Intertek performs the Services based on a random sampling of their products and on testing of limited parameters through a risk assessment approach. The Client agrees to take responsibility and acknowledges that they are aware of the customs legislative and regulatory requirements governing the import of their products and commit to comply with those requirements.
- 3.2 In the event that the Services provided relate to any third party, the Client shall cause any such third party to acknowledge and agree to the provisions in this Agreement and the Proposal prior to and as a condition precedent to such third party receiving any Reports or the benefit of any Services.
- 3.3 The Client further agrees:
- (a) to co-operate with Intertek in all matters relating to the Services and appoint a manager in relation to the Services who shall be duly authorised to provide instructions to Intertek on behalf of the Client and to bind the Client contractually as required;
 - (b) to provide Intertek (including its agents, sub-contractors and employees), at its own expense, any and all products, samples, information, material or other documentation necessary for the execution of the Services in a timely manner sufficient to enable Intertek to provide the Services in accordance with this Agreement. The Client acknowledges that any samples provided may become damaged or be destroyed in the course of testing as part of the necessary testing process and undertakes to hold Intertek harmless from any and all responsibility for such alteration, damage or destruction;
 - (c) that it is responsible for providing the samples/equipment to be tested together, where appropriate, with any specified additional items, including but not limited to connecting pieces, fuse-links, etc;
 - (d) to provide instructions and feedback to Intertek in a timely manner;
 - (e) to provide Intertek (including its agents, sub-contractors and employees) with access to its premises as may be reasonably required for the provision of the Services and to any other relevant premises at which the Services are to be provided;
 - (f) prior to Intertek attending any premises for the performance of the Services, to inform Intertek of all applicable health and safety rules and regulations and other reasonable security requirements that may apply at any relevant premises at which the Services are to be provided;
 - (g) to notify Intertek promptly of any risk, safety issues, incident, or if the minimum Wi-Fi connectivity requirements cannot be met in respect of any item delivered by the Client, or any process or systems used at its premises or otherwise necessary for the provision of the Services;
 - (h) to inform Intertek in advance of any applicable import/ export restrictions that may apply to the Services to be provided, including any instances where any products, information or technology may be exported/ imported to or from a country that is restricted or banned from such transaction;
 - (i) in the event of the issuance of a certificate, to inform and advise Intertek immediately of any changes during the term of the certificate which may have a material impact on the accuracy of the certification;
 - (j) to obtain and maintain all necessary licenses and consents in order to comply with relevant legislation and regulation in relation to the Services;
 - (k) that it will not use any Reports issued by Intertek pursuant to this Agreement in a misleading manner and that it will only distribute such Reports in their entirety;
 - (l) in no event, will the contents of any Reports or any extracts, excerpts or parts of any Reports be distributed or published without the prior written consent of Intertek (such consent not to be unreasonably withheld) in each instance;
 - (m) that any and all advertising and promotional materials or any statements made by the Client will not give a false or misleading impression to any third party concerning the services provided by Intertek; and
 - (n) that Intertek may share any Report, data, and documentation gathered and generated during the performance of the Services to the extent requested by the relevant authorities
- 3.4 The Client agrees that all products requested for Certification are not affected by any product recalls nor substandard or counterfeit, to the best of their knowledge. The Client declares under their own responsibility that the products requested for Certification satisfy the requirements of the standards and other regulations applicable for the type of products being exported. The Client agrees that at the time of the submission of the Request for Shipment Certification, the shipment is still in the country of supply and is accessible for inspection, if needed.
- 3.5 Intertek shall be neither in breach of this Agreement nor liable to the Client for any breach of this Agreement if and to the extent that its breach is a direct result of a failure by the Client to comply with its obligations as set out in this Clause 3. The Client also acknowledges that the impact of any failure by the Client to perform its obligations set out herein on the provision of the Services by Intertek will not affect the Client's obligations under this Agreement for payment of the Charges pursuant to Clause 4 below.

4. CHARGES, INVOICING AND PAYMENT

- 4.1 The parties agree that the Services are provided on the terms and subject to the conditions set out or referred to in this Agreement, and that this Agreement shall take precedence over any terms and





- conditions which the Client has provided or may in the future provide to Intertek, whether in a purchase order or any other document.
- 4.2 The Client shall pay Intertek the charges set out in the Proposal, if applicable, or as otherwise contemplated for provision of the Services (the **Charges**).
- 4.3 If pricing factors, such as salaries and/or rates are subject to change between the conclusion date of the Contract and the completion date of the Contract, Intertek has the right to adjust the Charges accordingly.
- 4.4 The Charges are expressed exclusive of any applicable taxes. The Client shall pay any applicable taxes on the Charges at the rate and in the manner prescribed by law, on the issue by Intertek of a valid invoice.
- 4.5 The Client agrees that it will reimburse Intertek for any expenses incurred by Intertek relating to the provision of the Services and is wholly responsible for any freight or customs clearance fees relating to any testing samples.
- 4.6 The Charges represent the total fees to be paid by the Client for the Services pursuant to this Agreement. Any additional work performed by Intertek will be charged on a time and material basis.
- 4.7 Intertek shall invoice the Client for the Charges and expenses, if any. For Services provided over the course of a period of greater than thirty (30) days the Client agrees that at the end of each calendar month Intertek will issue an invoice for the cost of the Services provided in the month. A final invoice will be issued on the date of the completion of the Services.
- 4.8 The Client is required to pay all invoiced amounts without any deduction, discount or set-off no later than thirty (30) days after the invoice date. No deduction for bank charges incurred can be made. Payments, which must be denominated in the currency indicated in the invoice, must be made by means of money transfer to a bank account designated by Intertek.
- 4.9 Intertek will issue an electronic invoice to the Client. An electronic invoice may be sent by email and will be deemed to have been delivered to the Client upon receipt of such email. Intertek is under no obligation to fulfil any request by the Client for a paper copy to be sent by post. Any invoice sent by post will include a £25 administration fee and the paper invoice must be paid by the Client within the credit terms referred to in 4.8 of this Agreement.
- 4.10 If Intertek believes that the Client's financial position and/or payment performance justifies such action, Intertek has the right to demand that the Client immediately furnish security or additional security in a form to be determined by Intertek and/or make an advance payment. If the Client fails to furnish the desired security, Intertek has the right, without prejudice to its other rights, to immediately suspend the further execution of all or any part of the Services, and any Charges for any part of the Services which has already been performed shall become immediately due and payable.
- 4.11 If the Client fails to pay within the period referred to in 4.8 above, it is in default of its payment obligations and this Agreement after having been reminded by Intertek at least once that payment is due within a reasonable period. In that case, the Client is liable to pay interest on the credit balance with effect from the date on which the payment became due until the date of payment. The interest rate applied is deemed to be the Bank of England base rate plus 5%. In addition, all collection costs incurred after the Client's default, both judicial and extrajudicial, are for the Client's account. The extrajudicial costs are set at an amount equal to at least 10% of the principal plus interest, without prejudice to Intertek's right to collect the actual extrajudicial costs in excess of this amount. The judicial costs comprise all costs incurred by Intertek, even if they exceed the Bank of England base rate.
- 4.12 If the Client objects to the contents of the invoice, details of the objection must be raised with Intertek within seven (7) days of receipt of electronic invoice, otherwise the invoice will be deemed to have been accepted. Any such objections do not exempt the Client from its obligation to pay within the period referred to in 4.8 above.
- 4.13 Any request by the Client for certain information to be included in or appended to the invoice must be made at the time of setting out the Proposal. A later request by the Client for changes to the agreed format of the invoice or supplementary information will not discharge the Client from its obligation to pay within the period referred to in 4.8. Intertek reserves the right to charge a £25 administration fee per invoice for issuing additional copies of invoices or amending invoice detail, format or structure from that agreed in the Proposal. Intertek maintains the right to reject such an invoicing amendment request and such a rejection by Intertek of the Client's request will not exempt the Client from its obligation to pay within the period referred to in 4.8 above.
- 4.14 If actions by the Client delay completion of the Services, Intertek has the right to invoice the Client for the cost of all Services provided to date. In such a scenario the Client agrees to pay this invoice within thirty (30) days of the invoice date.
- 4.15 Upon submission of samples or any other testing material or performance of the Services from the Client to Intertek shall be deemed to be conclusive evidence of the Client's acceptance of this Agreement.
- 5. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS AND DATA PROTECTION**
- 5.1 All Intellectual Property Rights belonging to a party prior to entry into this Agreement shall remain vested in that party. Nothing in this Agreement is intended to transfer any Intellectual Property Rights from either party to the other.
- 5.2 In the event of provision of certification services, Client agrees and acknowledges that the use of certification marks may be subject to national and international laws and regulations.
- 5.3 All Intellectual Property Rights in any Reports, document, graphs, charts, photographs or any other material (in whatever medium) produced by Intertek pursuant to this Agreement shall belong to Intertek. The Client shall have the right to use any such Reports, document, graphs, charts, photographs or other material for the purposes of this Agreement.
- 5.4 The Client agrees and acknowledges that Intertek retains any and all proprietary rights in concepts, ideas and inventions that may arise during the preparation or provision of any Report (including any deliverables provided by Intertek to the Client) and the provision of the Services to the Client.
- 5.5 Both parties shall observe all statutory provisions with regard to data protection including but not limited to the provisions of the General Data Protection Regulation 2016/679 ("GDPR") and shall comply with all applicable requirements of the GDPR. To the extent that Intertek processes personal data in connection with the Services or otherwise in connection with this Agreement, it shall take all necessary technical and organisational measures to ensure the security of such data (and to guard against unauthorised or unlawful processing, accidental loss, destruction or damage to such data) in line with the GDPR.
- 6. CONFIDENTIALITY**
- 6.1 Where a party (the **Receiving Party**) obtains Confidential Information of the other party (the **Disclosing Party**) in connection with this Agreement (whether before or after the date of this Agreement) it shall, subject to Clauses 6.2 to 6.4:
- (a) keep that Confidential Information confidential, by applying the standard of care that it uses for its own Confidential Information;
- (b) use that Confidential Information only for the purposes of performing obligations under this Agreement; and
- (c) not disclose that Confidential Information to any third party without the prior written consent of the Disclosing Party.
- 6.2 The Receiving Party may disclose the Disclosing Party's Confidential Information on a "need to know" basis:
- (a) to any legal advisers and statutory auditors that it has engaged for itself;
- (b) to any regulator having regulatory or supervisory authority over its business;
- (c) to any director, officer or employee of the Receiving Party provided that, in each case, the Receiving Party has first advised that person of the obligations under Clause 6.1 and ensured that the person is bound by obligations of confidence in respect of the Confidential Information no less onerous than those set out in this Clause 6; and
- (d) where the Receiving Party is Intertek, to any of its subsidiaries, affiliates or subcontractors.
- 6.3 The provisions of Clauses 6.1 and 6.2 shall not apply to any Confidential Information which:
- (a) was already in the possession of the Receiving Party prior to its receipt from the Disclosing Party without restriction on its use or disclosure;
- (b) is or becomes public knowledge other than by breach of this Clause 5.5;
- (c) is received by the Receiving Party from a third party who lawfully acquired it and who is under no obligation restricting its disclosure; or
- (d) is independently developed by the Receiving Party without access to the relevant Confidential Information.
- 6.4 The Receiving Party may disclose Confidential Information of the Disclosing Party to the extent required by law, any regulatory authority or the rules of any stock exchange on which the Receiving Party is listed, provided that the Receiving Party has given the Disclosing Party prompt written notice of the requirement to disclose and where possible given the Disclosing Party a reasonable opportunity to prevent the disclosure through appropriate legal means.
- 6.5 Each party shall ensure the compliance by its employees, agents and representatives (which, in the case of Intertek, includes procuring the same from any sub-contractors) with its obligations under this Clause 6.
- 6.6 No licence of any Intellectual Property Rights is given in respect of any Confidential Information solely by the disclosure of such Confidential Information by the Disclosing Party.
- 6.7 With respect to archival storage, the Client acknowledges that Intertek may retain in its archive for the period required by its quality and assurance processes, or by the testing and certification rules of the relevant accreditation body, all materials necessary to document the Services provided.
- 7. AMENDMENT**
- 7.1 No amendment to this Agreement shall be effective unless it is in writing, expressly stated to amend this Agreement and signed by an authorised signatory of each party.
- 8. FORCE MAJEURE**
- 8.1 Neither party shall be liable to the other for any delay in performing or failure to perform any obligation under this Agreement to the extent that such delay or failure to perform is a result of:
- (a) war (whether declared or not), civil war, riots, revolution, acts of terrorism, military action, sabotage and/or piracy;
- (b) natural disasters such as violent storms, earthquakes, tidal waves, floods and/or lighting; explosions and fires;
- (c) strikes and labour disputes, other than by any one or more employees of the affected party or of any supplier or agent of the affected party; or
- (d) failures of utilities companies such as providers of telecommunication, internet, gas or electricity services.
- 8.2 For the avoidance of doubt, where the affected party is Intertek any failure or delay caused by failure or delay on the part of a subcontractor shall only be a Force Majeure Event (as defined in 8.1 above) where the subcontractor is affected by one of the events described above.
- 8.3 A party whose performance is affected by an event described in Clause 8.1 (a **Force Majeure Event**) shall:
- (a) promptly notify the other party in writing of the Force Majeure Event and the cause and the likely duration of any consequential delay or non-performance of its obligations;
- (b) use all reasonable endeavours to avoid or mitigate the effect of the Force Majeure Event and continue to perform or resume performance of its affected obligations as soon as reasonably possible; and
- (c) continue to provide Services that remain unaffected by the Force Majeure Event.
- 8.4 If the Force Majeure Event continues for more than sixty (60) days after the day on which it started, each party may terminate this Agreement by giving at least ten (10) days' written notice to the other party.
- 9. LIMITATIONS AND EXCLUSIONS OF LIABILITY**
- 9.1 Neither party excludes or limits liability to the other party:
- (a) for death or personal injury resulting from the negligence of that party or its directors, officers, employees, agents or sub-contractors; or
- (b) for its own fraud (or that of its directors, officers, employees, agents or sub-contractors).
- 9.2 The maximum aggregate liability of Intertek in contract, tort (including negligence and breach of statutory duty) or otherwise for any breach of this agreement or any matter arising out of or in connection with the services to be provided in accordance with this agreement shall be the total amount of fees paid under this Agreement
- 9.3 Intertek shall not be liable in contract, tort (including negligence and breach of statutory duty) or otherwise for any:
- (a) loss of profits;
- (b) loss of sale or business;
- (c) loss of opportunity (including without limitation in relation to third party agreements or contracts);
- (d) loss of or damage to goodwill or reputation;
- (e) loss of anticipated savings;
- (f) cost or expense incurred in relation to making a product recall;
- (g) loss of use or corruption of software, data or information;
- (h) any delayed partial or total non-performance of the Services arising directly or indirectly from any event outside of Intertek's control including failure of the client to comply with its obligations as set out in this Agreement; and
- (i) any indirect, consequential loss, punitive or special loss (even when advised of their possibility).
- 9.4 ANY CLAIM BY THE CLIENT AGAINST INTERTEK (ALWAYS SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THIS CLAUSE 10) MUST BE MADE WITHIN NINETY (90) DAYS AFTER THE CLIENT BECOMES AWARE OF ANY CIRCUMSTANCES GIVING RISE TO ANY SUCH CLAIM. FAILURE TO GIVE SUCH NOTICE OF CLAIM WITHIN NINETY (90) DAYS SHALL CONSTITUTE A BAR OR IRREVOCABLE WAIVER TO ANY CLAIM, EITHER DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY, IN CONTRACT, TORT OR OTHERWISE IN CONNECTION WITH THE PROVISION OF SERVICES UNDER THIS AGREEMENT.
- 10. INDEMNITY**
- 10.1 The Client shall indemnify and hold harmless Intertek, its officers, employees, agents, representatives, contractors and sub-contractors from and against any and all claims, suits, liabilities (including costs of litigation and attorney's fees) arising, directly or indirectly, out of or in connection with:
- (a) any claims or suits by any governmental authority or others for any actual or asserted failure of the Client to comply with any law, ordinance, regulation, rule or order of any governmental or judicial authority;
- (b) claims or suits for personal injuries, loss of or damage to property, economic loss, and loss of or damage to Intellectual Property Rights incurred by or occurring to any person or entity and arising in connection with or related to the Services provided hereunder by Intertek, its officers, employees, agents, representatives, contractors and sub-contractors;
- (c) the breach or alleged breach by the Client of any of its obligations set out in Clause 1.4 and 3 above;
- (d) any claims made by any third party for loss, damage or expense of whatsoever nature and whatsoever arising relating to the performance, purported performance or non-performance of any Services to the extent that the aggregate of any such claims relating to any one Service exceeds the limit of liability set out in Clause 9 above;
- (e) any claims or suits arising as a result of any misuse or unauthorised use of any Reports issued by Intertek or any Intellectual Property Rights belonging to Intertek (including trademarks) pursuant to this Agreement;
- (f) any claims arising out of or relating to any third party's use of or reliance on any Reports or any reports, analyses, conclusions of the Client (or any third party to whom the Client has provided the Reports) based in whole or in part on the Reports, if applicable; and
- (g) any claims by any third party relating to the performance or non-performance of a Remote Inspection.
- 10.2 The obligations set out in this Clause 10 shall survive termination of this Agreement.



11. INSURANCE POLICIES

- 11.1 Each party shall be responsible for the arrangement and costs of its own company insurance which includes, without limitation, professional indemnity, employer's liability, motor insurance and property insurance.
- 11.2 Intertek expressly disclaims any liability to the Client as an insurer or guarantor.
- 11.3 The Client acknowledges that although Intertek maintains employer's liability insurance, such insurance does not cover any employees of the Client or any third parties who may be involved in the provision of the Services. If the Services are to be performed at premises belonging to the Client or third parties, Intertek's employer's liability insurance does not provide cover for non-Intertek employees.

12. TERMINATION

- 12.1 This Agreement shall commence upon the first day on which the Services are commenced and shall continue, unless terminated earlier in accordance with this Clause 12, until the Services have been provided.
- 12.2 This Agreement may be terminated by:
- (a) either party if the other continues in material breach of any obligation imposed upon it hereunder for more than thirty (30) days after written notice has been dispatched by that Party by recorded delivery or courier requesting the other to remedy such breach;
 - (b) Intertek on written notice to the Client in the event that the Client fails to pay any invoice by its due date and/or fails to make payment after a further request for payment; or
 - (c) either party on written notice to the other in the event that the other makes any voluntary arrangement with its creditors or becomes subject to an administration order or (being an individual or firm) becomes bankrupt or (being a company) goes into liquidation (otherwise than for the purposes of a solvent amalgamation or reconstruction) or an encumbrancer takes possession, or a receiver is appointed, of any of the property or assets of the other or the other ceases, or threatens to cease, to carry on business.
- 12.3 In the event of termination of the Agreement for any reason and without prejudice to any other rights or remedies the parties may have, the Client shall pay Intertek for all Services performed up to the date of termination. This obligation shall survive termination or expiration of this Agreement.
- 12.4 Any termination or expiration of the Agreement shall not affect the accrued rights and obligations of the parties nor shall it affect any provision which is expressly or by implication intended to come into force or continue in force on or after such termination or expiration.

13. ASSIGNMENT AND SUB-CONTRACTING

- 13.1 Intertek reserves the right to delegate the performance of its obligations hereunder and the provision of the Services to one or more of its affiliates and/ or sub-contractors when necessary. Intertek may also assign this Agreement to any company within the Intertek group on notice to the Client.

14. GOVERNING LAW AND DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- 14.1 This Agreement and the Proposal shall be governed by the laws of England and Wales. The parties agree to submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the English Courts in respect of any dispute or claim arising out

of or in connection with this Agreement (including any non-contractual claim relating to the provision of the Services in accordance with this Agreement).

15. MISCELLANEOUS

Severability

- 15.1 If any provision of this Agreement is or becomes invalid, illegal or unenforceable, such provision shall be severed and the remainder of the provisions shall continue in full force and effect as if this Agreement had been executed without the invalid, illegal or unenforceable provision. If the invalidity, illegality or unenforceability is so fundamental that it prevents the accomplishment of the purpose of this Agreement, Intertek and the Client shall immediately commence good faith negotiations to agree an alternative arrangement.

No partnership or agency

- 15.2 Nothing in this Agreement and no action taken by the parties under this Agreement shall constitute a partnership, association, joint venture or other co-operative entity between the parties or constitute any party the partner, agent or legal representative of the other.

Waivers

- 15.3 Subject to Clause 9.4 above, the failure of any party to insist upon strict performance of any provision of this Agreement, or to exercise any right or remedy to which it is entitled, shall not constitute a waiver and shall not cause a diminution of the obligations established by this Agreement. A waiver of any breach shall not constitute a waiver of any subsequent breach.
- 15.4 No waiver of any right or remedy under this Agreement shall be effective unless it is expressly stated to be a waiver and communicated to the other party in writing.

Whole Agreement

- 15.5 This Agreement and the Proposal contain the whole agreement between the parties relating to the transactions contemplated by this agreement and supersedes all previous agreements, arrangements and understandings between the parties relating to those transactions or that subject matter. No purchase order, statement or other similar document will add to or vary the terms of this Agreement.
- 15.6 Each party acknowledges that in entering into this Agreement it has not relied on any representation, warranty, collateral contract or other assurance (except those set out or referred to in this Agreement) made by or on behalf of any other party before the acceptance or signature of this Agreement. Each party waives all rights and remedies that, but for this Clause, might otherwise be available to it in respect of any such representation, warranty, collateral contract or other assurance.
- 15.7 Nothing in this Agreement limits or excludes any liability for fraudulent misrepresentation.

Third Party Rights

- 15.8 A person who is not party to this Agreement has no right under the Contract (Rights of Third Parties) Act 1999 to enforce any of its terms.

Further Assurance

- 15.9 Each party shall, at the cost and request of any other party, execute and deliver such instruments and documents and take such other actions in each case as may be reasonably requested from time to time in order to give full effect to its obligations under this Agreement.
